Rel 15- This course is an examination of Christianity and its impact on culture. Some of the topics include how we define culture, the impact of Jesus' example in our everyday lives, relations with each other, the church, and the world as a whole.

Rel 25 -

This course offers students a glimpse of the history of the Catholic Church. We will look at how the Church has developed over the past 2000 years. Our study will look at some of the Jewish traditions upon which Catholicism is built, the primacy of Christ in the Catholic Church, the historical importance of Christ, and the development of the Church (trials and tribulations) since the times of the apostles to the more modern era. We will not be discussing so much the faith and beliefs of Catholicism, as we will be attempting to understand how this faith and these beliefs have developed over time.

Rel 35- This course takes a philosophical approach to ethical and moral questions which Christianity seeks to answer and address. The philosophies of Levinas, Kant and Aristotle are examined in a way that provides differing ways of looking at and acting in response to current moral and ethical issues.
