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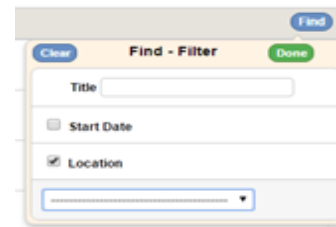

WONDERING *HOW* TO REGISTER?

1. All of the events can be found at centreforlearning.ca by clicking on **Events tab**.
