JUNE 11 LAP LOOM WEAVING

In ancient times, many households kept sheep, goats or camels and used their hair or wool to make clothing. Lap looms are small portable weaving tools used to speed up the process of moving one thread up and down through another thread to create a piece of woven fabric. The weaving process helps to promote basic math concepts, fine motor control, dexterity, concentration, self-confidence and a sense of accomplishment. Students will gain a basic understanding of how wool is carded, spun into threads and then woven on a small loom. Students will leave this workshop with a decorative fibre art wall hanging or coaster.

EVENT VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Centre for Learning@HOME is actively recruiting volunteers to help chaperone events.

Volunteer Role and Responsibilities

Volunteers may be responsible for supervising a group of students at events. Student ages will range from 5-18 years of age and student group sizes ranging from 5 - 25 dependent on the event. Volunteers may be contacted to attend events when the Program Enhancement Coordinator requires assistance. Volunteers may be asked to chaperone several events per year.

Qualifications and Education Requirements

Friendly, responsible adult who enjoys working with and supervising students of all ages. A criminal records check with vulnerable sector required for all successful candidates.

Preferred Skills

Friendly, approachable, responsible; experience working with children is an asset.

Benefits

The Centre for Learning@HOME will cover the cost of volunteer's event registration and one CFL student registration while volunteering.

STUDENT SUPERVISION STANDARDS AND PARENT PARTICIPATION

All field trips and events hosted by The Centre for Learning@HOME require supervision to ensure acceptable levels of behavior and safety. The Centre for Learning@HOME will have at least one school staff member on site at every event we host. Staff, and when necessary, parent volunteers (who have provided police issued security clearance documents), will attend events to meet the necessary supervision ratios set out by Christ the Redeemer Catholic Schools and as listed below.

The CFL welcomes parents to participate in activities and events whenever possible. Some events require every participant be supervised by a parent; other events/venues restrict parent participation. The role of the parent is included in each event description. Please see below for an explanation of the rational.

1. Parent Participation is Mandatory

In this scenario, the students will require one on one assistance to complete the task or the venue has asked us to have a parent with each child. A CFL staff member will be there to assist the event leader, check in students and parents, and obtain the activity waiver forms.

2. Parent Participation is Voluntary

In this scenario, the parents are welcome to stay and participate, or release their student(s) to the care of The CFL staff and approved volunteers. The ratio of adults to students is in accordance with Christ the Redeemer Catholic Schools' policy (below). If the parent elects to drop their student(s) off, they must deliver the student(s) to the school staff member at the event to check them in and sign the activity waiver. At the end of the event, the parent must collect the student(s) from the school staff member at the specified time and ensure the staff member knows the parent has arrived to pick up the student(s). Please do not drop your student off at the door or plan to pick them up outside.

3. Parent Participation is Restricted or Not Allowed

In this scenario, the host venue has asked that parents not participate either due to the nature of the event (i.e. swim lessons) or because of limited space. The Centre for Learning@HOME will provide supervision according to the supervision standard set by Christ the Redeemer Catholic Schools. Parents may be able to watch from the sidelines (like in swim lessons) or drop the student(s) off and pick them up at the end of the program. When dropping off your student(s), please deliver the student(s) to the school staff member at the event to check them in and sign the activity waiver. At the end of the event, the parent must collect the student(s) from the school staff member at the specified time and ensure the staff member knows you have arrived to pick up the student(s). Please do not drop your student off at the door or plan to pick them up outside.

If arrangements are made for someone other than the parent/guardian to pick up a student, please notify The CFL staff member, in writing, prior to the start of the event.



Supervision Ratios as set by Christ the Redeemer Catholic Schools for Field Trips

Grade Level	Adult: Student Ratio
1-3	1:5
4-6	1:10
7-9	1:15
10-12	1:25

Please note, some activities replicate a classroom setting (example: teacher led co-curricular classes) and in such situations, the Field Trip Supervision Ratios will not apply. Ratios similar to a traditional classroom will apply.
