

## What to Prepare for a Home Education Visit

As per the AB Home Education regulations, please date all work, and have it available for review at the visit. See the list below for further instructions. If you are completing some lessons orally, or want to keep a record of all the projects and art work, take pictures or videos of work that has been completed.

1. Fill out the Celebrate Learning Sheet! (sent by your Visiting Teacher)
2. Have a list of book recently read available
3. Pick a current writing sample or favourite pages of a book to read at the visit, if you like.
4. Write down the current page or chapter from workbooks or text-based subjects out of the total in the book i.e. page 22/365 or Chapter 2/16. If you would like test scores recorded in the assessment, please have the average available
5. Tab or bookmark Math books and have them available for review. Record the key concepts that have been covered to date, or photocopy the Table of Contents.
6. Have Workbooks and Binders available for review if needed for reference
7. Display any Projects that have been a part of the child's program (or take pictures!)
8. Have Awards from sporting events available if the child would like to share them
9. If the child would like to play an instrument they are studying, select a favorite piece.
10. We are often asked if the children need to be present. Yes, that is required, and we would love to have them share some of their highlights from the term.

### **Suggestions:**

- Consider purchasing a teacher lesson plan book to help you stay organized and record what has taken place each week. This can also help promote independence in your children.
- If you have specific questions regarding your child's program or learning, please email them to your Visiting Teacher before the visit and they will be prepared to discuss them with you.
